

#### **Motivating Reluctant Readers**

#### **Synopsis**

Unfortunately, 'reluctant reader' has become a familiar frozen collocation. Reluctance to read may be caused by all kinds of physical or psychological barriers, and it is the teacher's task to find effective ways of enabling learners to move out of the vicious circle of reluctance and into a virtuous circle of motivation. The challenge for the teacher is to select or devise motivational strategies that will enhance the reading experience without imposing an unwieldy pedagogic apparatus. This workshop will explore approaches to motivating reluctant readers, focusing particularly on pre-reading and follow-up activities. As well as proposing classroom strategies, the session will provide opportunities for participants to share their own experience and exchange practical teaching ideas. Participants will take away a generative task design framework, which should be transferable to a wide range of texts at different levels.

#### Facilitator: Alan Pulverness

Alan Pulverness is Senior Academic Consultant with NILE (the Norwich Institute for Language Education) and the co-author of a number of ELT textbooks, including the award-winning *Macmillan Short Course Programme* (1993; 1995). He has edited students' editions of *Macbeth* (SEI 2000; Cornelsen 2005) and *Romeo and Juliet* (Corbnelsen 2007) and was editorial adviser for *The Literary Labyrinth* (SEI 1993) and *The World Wide Reader* (OUP & La Nuova Italia 2001). Among his recent publications is *The TKT Course* (CUP 2005). From 2000 to 2004 he edited *IATEFL Conference Selections*. He also co-chaired the British Council Oxford Conference on the Teaching of Literature from 2002 to 2006.

#### Online Writing Evaluation and Language Learning

#### **Synopsis**

The first half of this workshop explores the use of online English Language learning resources. Specifically, it takes a close look at the possibilities presented by the *Criterion* website (<a href="http://criterion4.ets.org/cwe/">http://criterion4.ets.org/cwe/</a>), particularly with regard to online writing evaluation. Participants get to discover the various features of this web facility; of primary interest are the tools which help students to edit and improve their essays, learn the language and submit their work online. Users need only to know basic word-processing skills and have an internet connection.

The second half of the workshop will focus on the Star Reading (SR) and Accelerated Reading (AR) Programmes. Star Reading (SR) is a web-based diagnostic test that determines the reading level of each student, and tracks individual and class growth using a computer-adaptive Star Reading test in less than 10 minutes. The accompanying Accelerated Reader (AR) personalises reading practice to each student's current level and assesses students' reading with four types of quizzes: Reading Practice, Vocabulary Practice, Literacy Skills, and Textbook Quizzes.

#### Facilitator: Dominic Kenneth Wee and Sng TE

Dominic Kenneth Wee is currently Head of Department (English) at Zhenghua Secondary School. His qualifications include the degree of Bachelor of Arts (NUS, 1982), Diploma in Education (with credit) (NUS, 1984), Diploma in Applied Linguistics (with credit) (SEAMEO Regional Language Center, 1989) and Further Professional Diploma in Education (Secondary) (with credit) (NTU, NIE, 1998).

Sng TE is currently serving as Subject Head (ICT) in Zhenghua Secondary School. Presently studying for his Masters in Education, he graduated with a BA from NUS in 1992 and a PGDE in 1993.

#### Using Podcasting to Create and Wikis to Assess

#### **Synopsis**

This session aims to familiarise teachers with the how and why of podcasting, so as to enable them to harness the power of ICT for a more authentic learning experience in EL.

By the end of the session, teachers will be able to

- use applications such as GarageBand and Wikispace to produce and deliver their podcasts; and
- generate ideas for use in their own practice.

### Facilitators: Ms Clarisse Ng, & Apple

Ms Clarisse Ng has been the Head of Department for English Language and Literature at Yusof Ishak Secondary School since 2003. The YI ELL Department has been exploring the use of ICT for language learning, particularly in the areas of oral competency and media literacy. The school was recently selected as one of two pilot schools for the Digital Language Lab project.
